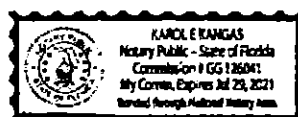

## Vaccinations urged after 3 measles cases

MIAMI — Health officials are urging parents to make sure their children are vaccinated against measles after three cases of the disease were reported in a Florida county, among more than 100 cases throughout the U.S. this year.

Federal officials declared the contagious virus had been eliminated in the U.S. in 2000, however, infections periodically occur nationwide, as the virus is still common in many other parts of the world.

Travelers can bring measles into the country, where it can spread among people who are not vaccinated.

The cases in Florida's Gulf coast county of Pinellas are the first there in 10 years. According to the U.S. Centers for Dis-

ease Control and Prevention, measles infections have been reported in over 100 people in 21 states and Washington, D.C., so far this year. Last year, 68 cases were reported nationwide, including an outbreak involving 65 patients in Minnesota. According to a CDC report, nearly all those cases lacked immunizations, and the incorrect perception that the measles-mumps-rubella vaccine was linked to autism had contributed to the low level of vaccinations in the affected communities.

In the last month, health officials have issued warnings about measles exposure in Minnesota, Boston and Michigan after isolated cases linked to international travel were confirmed. Health officials are encouraging parents to get the recommended vaccinations for their children.

One of the Florida cases being investigated involved an unvaccinated child who was infected in the state, according to the Florida Department of Health in Pinellas County. It was not known whether the child had an exemption to Florida's requirement for immunizations for all children attending school, Maggie Hall, spokeswoman for the Pinellas County health department, said Thursday.

Two other measles infections are being investigated in a separate Pinellas County household. The ages of these patients were not available, Hall said. They were infected in Florida and live in the same home, and neither had been immunized.

The source of the infections has not been identified, according to the health department.

"We are continuing to investigate, but

we would like families to know that their children could be exposed to diseases like measles anywhere and unless they're protected with vaccination they are risking potentially serious health effects for their child," Dr. Ulysses Choe, an infectious disease specialist and the county's health director, said in a statement Monday.

In July, measles infections were confirmed in two Florida residents and one visitor who were exposed to the virus while traveling in Brazil and France. Health officials said the residents had not been vaccinated and the visitor's vaccination status was unknown.

Measles is easily spread by air droplets when infected people breathe, cough, or sneeze. Symptoms include a high fever, cough, runny nose and red, watery eyes, followed by a blotchy rash.

## Lost hiker survives on berries and bees for almost a week

A 40-year-old Ohio man who was missing for almost a week after starting out on a day hike on Mount St. Helens in Washington state, survived by eating berries and bees, according to authorities and his mother.

Matthew Mathery, a nurse from Warren, Ohio, was in good condition but suffering from dehydration when he was found Wednesday by a 30-person search-and-rescue team.

His mother, Linda Mathery, told reporters that "there were after him the whole time, so he killed them and ate them." She also told reporters in front of a Vancouver, Washington, hospital that he had found berries, but not water.

Mathery was barefoot after his flip-flops broke during the ordeal.

## Study: Quit cigs even with weight gain

NEW YORK — If you quit smoking and gain weight, it may seem like you're trading one set of health problems for another. But a new U.S. study finds you're still better off in the long run.

Compared with smokers, even the quitters who gained the most weight had at least a 50 percent lower risk of dying prematurely from heart disease and other causes, the Harvard-led study found.

The study should dispel the myth that there are prohibitive weight-related health consequences to quitting cigarettes, said Dr. William Dietz, a public health expert at George Washington University.

"The paper makes pretty clear that your health improves, even if you gain weight," said Dietz, who was not involved in the research. "I don't think we know that with the assurance that this paper provides."

The New England Journal of Medicine

published the study Wednesday. The journal also published a Swedish study that found quitting smoking seemed to be the best thing diabetics can do to cut their risk of dying prematurely.

The nicotine in cigarettes can suppress appetite and boost metabolism. Many smokers who quit and don't step up their exercise find they eat more and gain weight — typically less than 10 pounds, but in some cases three times that much.

Weight gain is a cause of the most common form of diabetes, a disease in which blood sugar levels are higher than normal. Diabetes can lead to problems including blindness, nerve damage, heart and kidney disease and poor blood flow to the legs and feet.

In the U.S. study, researchers tracked more than 170,000 men and women over roughly 20 years, looking at what they said in health questionnaires given every two years.

The people enrolled in the studies were all health professionals, and did not

mirror current smokers in the general population, who are disproportionately low income, less educated and more likely to smoke heavily.

The researchers divided which study participants quit smoking and followed whether they gained weight and developed diabetes, heart disease or other conditions.

Quitters saw their risk of diabetes increase by 22 percent in the six years after they kicked the habit. An editorial in the journal characterized it as "a mild elevation" in the diabetes risk.

Studies previously showed that people who quit have an elevated risk of developing diabetes, said Dr. Qi Sun, one of the study's authors. He is a researcher at the Harvard-affiliated Brigham and Women's Hospital.

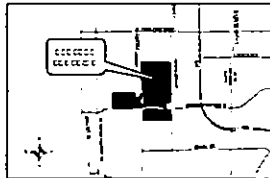
But that risk doesn't endure, and it never leads to a higher premature death rate than in what smokers face, he said.

"Regardless of the amount of weight gain, quitters always have a lower risk of dying," prematurely, Sun said.
