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Conclusions

Based upon the findings of this report, it was determined that the proposed rezoning of the subject property (*currently entitled for 526 multi-family units*) to allow either the development of 265 single-family dwelling units, or 526 multi-family units or a combination of single-family and multi-family dwelling units, so long as the trip cap of 259 two-way PM peak hour trips is not exceeded, will result in <u>no</u> net new impacts to the surrounding roadway network. More specifically, the previously approved 526 multi-family dwelling units will generate no more than 259 two-way PM peak hour trips, and the option of developing 265 single-family units will not generate more than 259 two-way PM trips, and the option of developing a mix of those two dwelling unit types will be limited to a trip cap of no more than 259 two-way PM trips. Therefore, no further analysis of the project's impacts to the adjacent roadways is required.

Forthcoming SDP Application

Unrelated to the zoning application is the <u>vested</u> development limitation placed upon the SDP application as follows:

If the Developer constructs more than the project's number of <u>vested</u> dwelling units (i.e., 483 multi-family units) per the PUD's DCA Agreement, dated July 21, 2005 and as amended by COA# 06-0148-09, or either constructs single-family units or a combination of single-family and multi-family units that generate more than the vested trip cap of 240 two-way PM peak hour trips but less than the zoning trip cap of 259 two-way Pm peak hour trips, then additional off-site impact analysis may be required at the time of acquiring SDP approval.

Methodology

The TIS methodology was established during the rezoning pre-application meeting, which was conducted for the specific purpose of amending the zoning to include the option of single-family dwelling units to the schedule of land uses. During the meeting, staff indicated that the applicant needed to demonstrate that the proposed amendment will not result in any additional site-generated trips than previously approved by the Collier County BCC. If determined that the trips will be net neutral or less, then no additional analysis was needed for the purpose of amending the project's schedule of uses to include single-family units. The \$500.00 methodology meeting fee will be paid at the time of submitting the zoning application.

Scope of Project

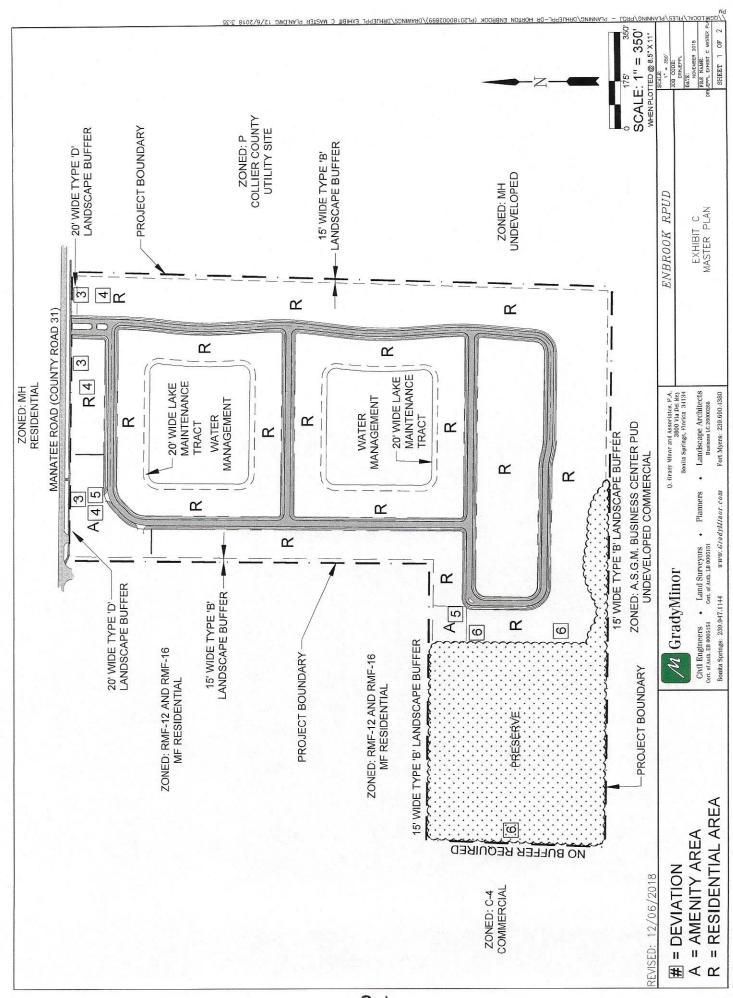
Enbrook PUD (a/k/a Tuscany Isles, a/k/a Journey's End) is an approved residential project that is currently entitled to develop up to 526 multi-family dwelling units and via the project's DCA Agreement is vested to develop up to 483 multi-family units. The applicant is requesting approval to amend the PUD's schedule of land uses to allow the development of no more than 265 single-family units. By doing so, the Developer will have the option of developing either 526 multi-family, or 265 single-family, or a combination of multi-family and single-family units so long as the project does not exceed 259 two-way PM peak hour trips.

However, if the Developer constructs more than the <u>vested</u> 483 multi-family units, or either constructs single-family units or a combination of single-family and multi-family units that generate more than the vested trip cap of 240 two-way PM peak hour trips, then additional off-site impact analysis may be required at the time of acquiring SDP approval.

The site is located on the south side of Manatee Road and approximately one-half mile east of Collier Boulevard, within Collier County.

Project Generated Traffic

Traffic that can be expected to be generated by the project was estimated based upon the guidelines established by the Institute of Transportation Engineers, Trip Generation Manual, 10th Edition. That is, historical traffic data collected at similar land uses was relied upon in estimating the project's traffic. It was concluded that Land Use Code "Single-Family" (LUC 210) and "Multi-Family" (LUC 220) were most appropriate in estimating the project traffic.

Table 1 provides a detail of the estimated total trips. Table B provides a summary of the results.

It can be concluded that the proposed rezoning of the subject property (*currently entitled for 526 multi-family units*) to allow either the development of 265 single-family dwelling units, or 526 multi-family units or a combination of single-family and multi-family dwelling units, so long as the trip cap of 259 two-way PM peak hour trips is not exceeded, will result in <u>no</u> net new impacts to the surrounding roadway network. More specifically, the previously approved 526 multi-family dwelling units will generate no more than 259 two-way PM peak hour trips, and the option of developing 265 single-family units will not generate more than 259 two-way PM trips, and the option of developing a mix of those two dwelling unit types will be limited to a trip cap of no more than 259 two-way PM trips. A five-year Temporary Certificate of Adequate Public Facility (COA) was previously issued which certified that adequate transportation facilities were available and that capacity was allocated for the above-referenced project. A total of five annual payments of 20% of the estimated road impact fees were required to be paid in order for the COA to remain valid. The Board of County Commissioners has recently approved a modification related to the payments required to obtain and maintain a COA. The modification allows for a COA to be issued "in perpetuity" upon payment of 33% of the estimated Road Impact Fees as long as there is capacity available for the project.

All required annual payments to date have been submitted and capacity is still allocated for the project. Based on current rates, the Road Impact Fees that have been paid meet or exceed the 33% requirement; therefore, the remaining annual payments are no longer required and a new COA in perpetuity has been issued. A copy of the new COA is enclosed. The original COA must be signed for and can be picked up anytime during normal business hours at the address listed below.
